**Content:** The typical CCIDD experience consists of a 10-15 day program centered around education and reflection on global justice, specifically in the context of Mexico and Latin America. Although we offer two general types of programs, a faith-based experience and a secular experience, we design each program around the specific needs of a school, church or community group. Both types of programs include contact with urban and rural Mexicans working for change, visits to a diverse cross-section of communities, cooperatives and archeological sites. Within the program participants are encouraged through reflection and analysis to make connections between struggles for liberation in Mexico and similar struggles in communities at home.
